



What is Vista?




- The latest Windows OS

Looks Like XP




Search Tool

- Opens when the Start button is clicked
- Begin to type the search word and instantly a list of document, folders, and applications appear
- "Command" still brings up the DOS like window
- Win+E still brings up Explorer






New Explorer Look


- No more MY folders






Live Preview

- New View option in Explorer lets you preview a document without opening
- Use Ctrl+C to copy from the preview and paste elsewhere
 - No, you cannot paste into or change the preview view






Meeting Space

- Like Windows Messenger on steroids!






ReadyBoost!

- The flash memory device serves as an additional memory




Shadow Copy



- Shadow copy creates copies on a scheduled basis of files that have changed
 - Only incremental changes are save
 - Minimal disk space is used


Tagging Pictures

- Add tags to your pictures
 - Meaningful words or phrases that describe who or what is in the picture and where the picture was taken




Snipping Tool

- The Snipping Tool allows you to take a snapshot of anything you can view on the screen



Backup & Restore Center

- Backup entire computer to hard drive or CD/DVD



Emulation

- Vista works fine with emulation software
 - IBM iSeries Access (Client Access)
 - Requires a Vista version and Vista Business or better
 - MochaSoft
 - Has a Vista version , but the XP version seems to work fine

 - Can be upgrade to any premium version of Vista
- Home Premium
 - Can only be upgraded to Ultimate
 - Must reload to move to Business or Enterprise
- Enterprise
 - Best version for business – step up from Vista Business

- **Ultimate**
 - Windows Vista Ultimate is the choice for those who want to have it all
- **Home Premium**
 - Windows Vista Home Premium is the preferred edition for home desktop and mobile PCs
- **Home Basic**
 - Windows Vista Home Basic is ideal for homes with basic computing needs like e-mail, browsing the Internet, and viewing photos.
- **Business**
 - Windows Vista Business is the first edition of Windows designed specifically to meet the needs of small businesses
- **Enterprise**
 - Designed to significantly lower IT costs and risks, Windows Vista Enterprise meets the needs of large, global organizations with complex IT infrastructures


